Here are the experiences of two students from the recent Missions I Trip to Fairford.

Our trip to Fairford, MB left something in each of our hearts. The Missions I team ran a day camp with Pathway Camp Ministries over spring break. This experience brought the team together in a whole new way. Hard work and little sleep meant that we were all our 'truest selves', no masks. The kids were amazing. They taught us as much as we taught them. They showed us what we take for granted, as well as how to find joy wherever we are. The team found that the more we poured into the kids, the more God gave back to us through them. We found true joy when the kids were excited to see us, or when we had to play in the gym for a longer time each day. The people of Fairford were extremely welcoming to all of us. On Wednesday evening the team had the privilege of attending a fire at Mrs. Lenaghan's uncle's home. Many of her relatives came out and took genuine interest in each of our lives and backgrounds. We ate moose meat and bannock cooked over the fire, as well as traditional tea made from leaves they had picked themselves. This experience was one of many that left an impact. These people were so welcoming of strangers into their home. It showed us how we should act towards each other. From laughing with the children to sitting around a fire, we won't forget the people of Fairford or the impression they left on our lives.

Going to Fairford through Pathway Ministries was an eye-opening experience, to say the least. Seeing the level of community in Fairford completely shattered all the stereotypes that I have grown up with. The most encouraging part was to see how the whole community embraced us with open arms and how willing the children were to learn about Jesus. Experiencing the aboriginal culture from a different perspective has taught me a lot about community that I want to bring back to the school. Running a day-camp for 50 kids for 4 days straight isn't an easy task, as you can imagine. Even though I was physically drained after each day, God gave me supernatural joy and energy that lasted all week. I have to say that those kids impacted me more than I could've ever imagined. I got really close with many of them and it was very hard to say goodbye. I give all praises to God for giving me such a life-changing experience and for equipping me for such a task.


